

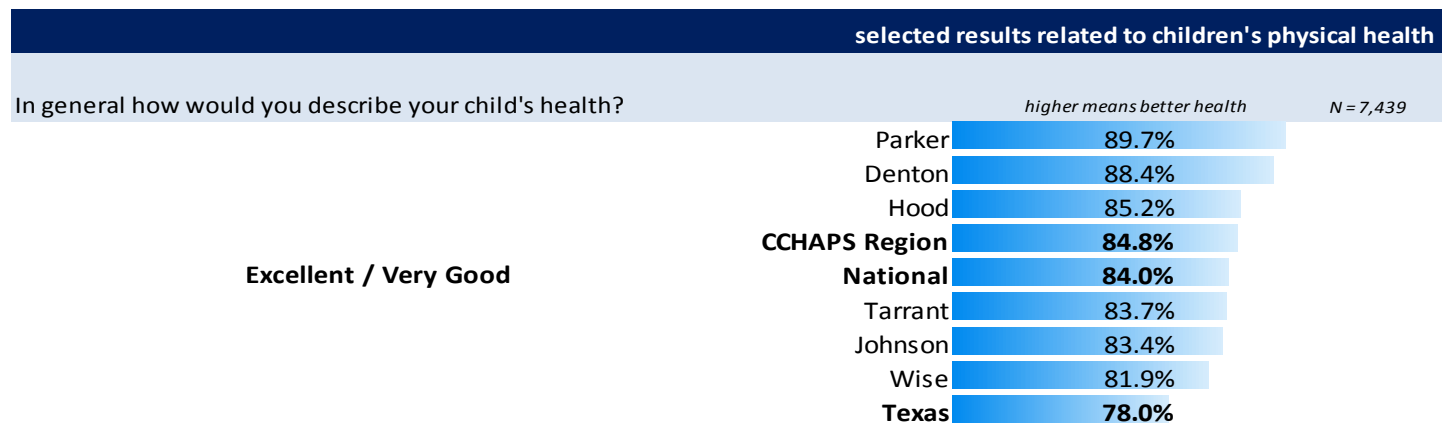
How does our children's general health compare to others?

CCHAPS asked parents, "In general, how would you describe your child's health? Because that question was also asked by the National Survey of Children's Health, this allows a comparison with the 7,439 parents in our community who responded:



CONCLUSIONS:

The health of children in the CCHAPS 6-county region compares with the National average and is significantly better than that of the State average.

The parents and leadership in our communities have done a great job of creating a healthy environment for children.

BUT, there is plenty of room to improve to make our community the healthiest place for children in the Nation.
