Highlight	Questions and Considerations
<p>All 16 school nurses completed the survey (100% response rate).</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Has there been a change in engagement strategies to explain this data? • Are program staff able to sustain these strategies for future years? • Have there been other unexpected benefits to engaging school nurses?
<p>88% are <u>very satisfied</u> with the way Program led screening day. <i>(previously 69%)</i></p> <p>94% think Program staff do an <u>excellent</u> job communicating with school nurses. <i>(previously 77%)</i></p> <p>75% think Program does an <u>excellent</u> job meeting the oral health needs of children. <i>(previously 62%)</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Each of these measures is higher this year than last year. And there has been an upwards shift from good to excellent & satisfied to very satisfied. • What changes have program staff implemented to explain these data? • What is happening and why?
<p>81% think CHW social services were <u>very important</u> in helping Program children in their school.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Last year, 100% thought social services were very important. • How does this data align with your expectations? • What else do you need to know to make an informed decision?
<p>94% of school nurses <u>strongly agree</u> they are satisfied with Program.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Last year, 77% strongly agreed. Why might that be?
